## MARKET COMMENTARY

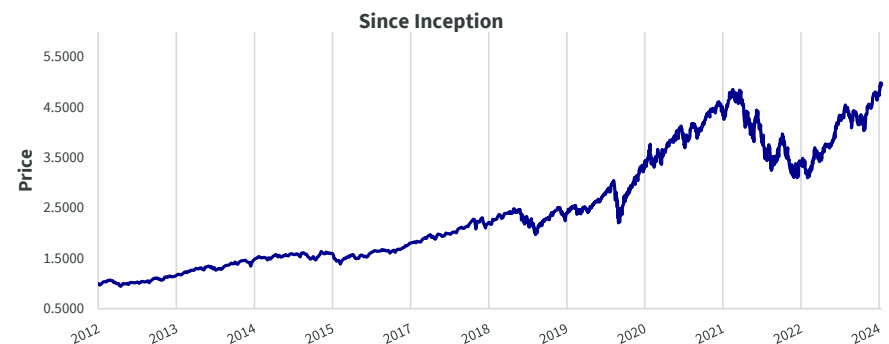
US stock markets began 2024 on a high note, with all three major indexes – the S&P 500, Dow Jones Industrial Average, and Nasdaq Composite – experiencing gains in January. However, this positive sentiment waned towards the end of the month as the Federal Reserve indicated that interest rate cuts in March were unlikely. The Fed maintained the current rate of 5.5% at its January 31st meeting. This decision came amidst mixed economic data. While the US economy grew at a robust 3.3% in the fourth quarter, exceeding the 2.0% forecast, inflation remained a concern. December's Consumer Price Index rose to 3.4%, higher than the projected 3.2%, dampening hopes for an immediate rate cut. Additionally, the unemployment rate remained steady at 3.7%, suggesting continued resilience in the labor market.

Overall, January presented a mixed picture for US equities. While the market enjoyed initial gains, the Fed's cautious stance on rate cuts and lingering inflation concerns introduced some uncertainty.

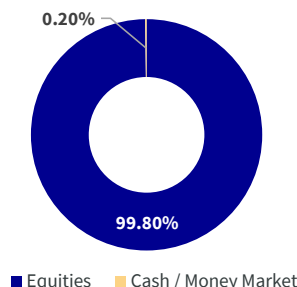
### NAVPU GRAPH
