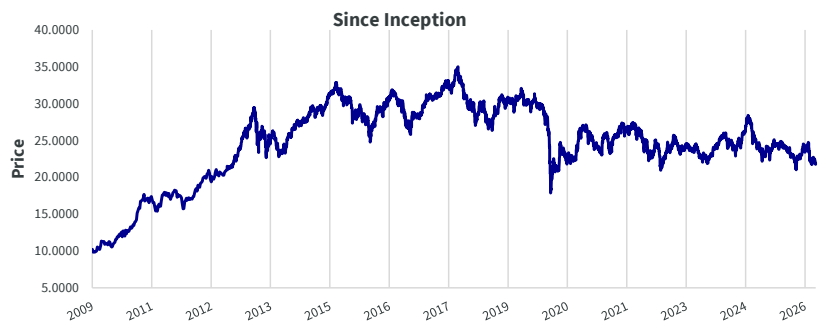

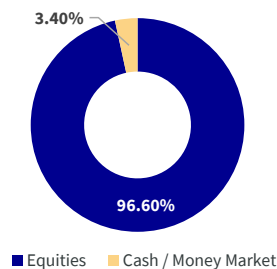

## MARKET COMMENTARY

Philippine equities declined in April, influenced by ongoing US-Iran tensions, a peso depreciation to Php61.57, and a shift in BSP monetary policy. The market experienced volatility, including a rally driven by ceasefire hopes, Fitch's outlook downgrade to negative, and rate hikes to combat rising inflation. Corporate earnings reflected macroeconomic stress, with property and consumer sectors underperforming due to weaker demand and rising costs, while banks increased provisions amid slowing growth. Conversely, defensive sectors such as power, utilities, telecoms, and staples outperformed as investors rotated into more resilient stocks amid heightened risk aversion. Overall, foreign outflows persisted, reversing early inflows and signaling ongoing geopolitical and macroeconomic headwinds for the Philippines.
